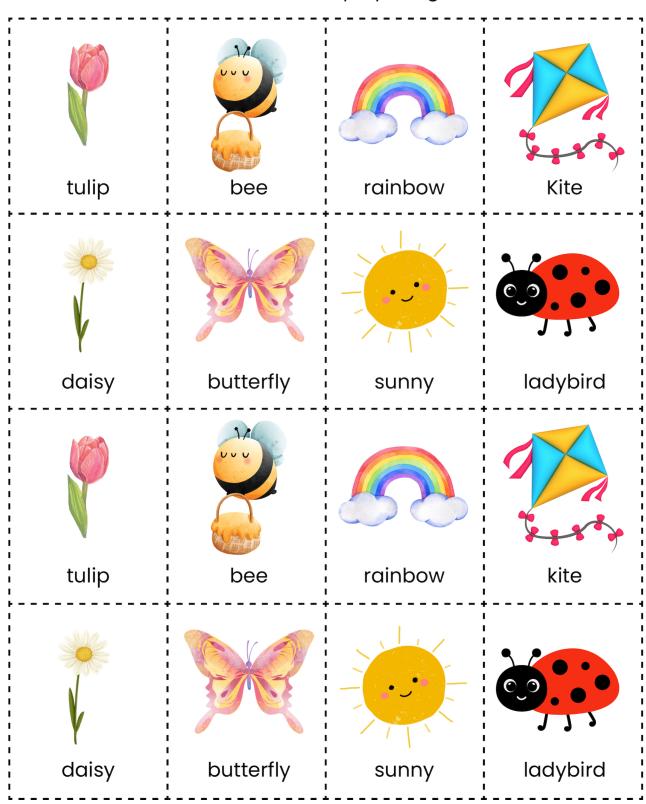

HOW TO PLAY?

- 1. Print the cards double sided and cut them out.
- 2. Shuffle the cards and lay them out face down in a grid formation on a table or the desk or floor. Make sure the cards are arranged neatly in rows and columns.
- 3. Explain to the children that the objective of the game is to find matching pairs of cards. Players take turns flipping over two cards at a time to see if they match. If they do, the player keeps the pair and gets a point. If they don't match, the cards are turned back over and it's the next player's turn.
- 4. Encourage the children to pay attention to the cards that are flipped over and remember where they are located. This helps to develop memory and concentration skills.
- 5. As the game progresses, ask the children to verbalize their thought process. For example, they can say things like, "I remember I saw the matching card here," or "I think I saw this card earlier."
- 6. The game continues until all the matching pairs have been found. The player with the most pairs at the end of the game wins.
- 7. Remember, the most important part of playing games with children is to have fun and enjoy the time spent together. Encourage good sportsmanship and praise their efforts regardless of the outcome.

Playing memory games not only provides entertainment but also helps children develop important cognitive skills such as memory, concentration and problem-solving.
